

# Church Documents Regarding Catechesis

**\*\*Catechism of the Catholic Church (2nd Ed.)** (CCC) United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, 1997. Revised in accordance with the official Latin text promulgated by Pope John Paul II in 1997, the second edition now includes more than a hundred additional pages, offering such new features as a glossary of terms, an index of citations from sources, and in-brief texts on core teachings. The essential elements of faith are presented in the most understandable manner, enabling everyone to read and know what the Church professes, celebrates, lives, and prays in her daily life.

**Compendium of the Catechism of the Catholic Church** United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, 2006. Offers a clear synopsis of the essential contents of the faith as promulgated in the Catechism of the Catholic Church in 598 questions and answers. The Compendium has a four-part structure and includes a section on common prayers and Catholic doctrinal formulas. Because of the question-and-answer format, catechetical leaders-parents, pastors, teachers, principals, and catechists-have a unique opportunity to dialogue with the faithful and to reinvigorate the Church's ongoing mission of evangelization and catechesis.

**\*\*United States Catholic Catechism for Adults** (USCCA) United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, 2006. Includes stories, doctrine, reflections, quotations, discussion questions, and prayers to lead the reader to a deepening faith. The United States Catholic Catechism for Adults is an excellent resource for preparation of catechumens in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults and for ongoing catechesis of adults. **General Directory for Catechesis** (GDC) United States Catholic Conference, 1998. An essential companion to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, the GDC provides religious educators, teachers, and catechists with a single point of reference for all aspects of catechetical instruction, for content and pedagogy, as well as for methodology. Beginning with an introductory reflection of how contemporary human and ecclesial conditions have impacted the preaching of the Gospel, the Directory moves through a detailed presentation of the goals and essential elements of catechesis, from its role in the Church's mission of evangelization, to norms and guidelines for its presentation, to adaptations for various groups and situations.

**The Catechetical Documents: A Parish Resource** Liturgy Training Publications, 1996. Gathered in this one book, find the major teachings about catechesis from the Second Vatican Council until the present. This is an essential reference tool for teachers, catechists, clergy, pastoral leaders, and students of catechesis. Includes the 1971 General Catechetical Directory, Basic Teachings for Catholic Religious Education, Sharing the Light of Faith, Guidelines for Doctrinally Sound Catechetical Materials, and many others. Each document is preceded by a general overview that describes the origin, context, and contribution of the document.

**\*\*National Directory for Catechesis** (NDC) United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, 2005. A companion to the General Directory for Catechesis (GDC), the National Directory for Catechesis builds on some of the core themes of the GDC, like catechesis's relationship to evangelization and worship, and provides practical tools for doing catechesis well. This is a "must-have" for anyone in catechesis or Catholic education-teachers, principals, directors, and coordinators of religious education and youth ministry, catechists, and students in the field. 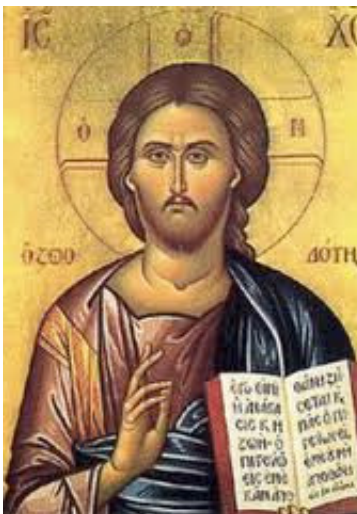
