

## OFFICIAL **Appointments**

The Most Rev. Alex J. Brunett, having carefully assessed the needs of the People of God in the Archdiocese of Seattle, and after careful consultation with the Christian Faithful and the Priest Personnel Board, makes the following pastoral appointments in accord with the 1983 Code of Canon Law.

### **PASTOR**

*The term of office for Pastor in the Archdiocese of Seattle is generally six years.*



**Very Rev. Paul A. Magnano,** appointed Pastor of Christ Our Hope Church in Seattle, effective

October 28, 2009 with continuing responsibility as the Episcopal Vicar for Clergy.



**Rev. Matthew L. O'Leary,** appointed Pastor of Holy Disciples Church in Puyallup and Our Lady of

Good Counsel Church in Eatonville, effective February 1, 2010.

### **PRIEST ADMINISTRATOR**

*The term of office for Priest Administrator in the Archdiocese of Seattle is generally one to three years.*



**Rev. R. Roy Baroma, Jr.,** appointed Priest Administrator of Sacred Heart Church in

Battle Ground, St. Mary of Guadalupe Church in Ridgefield and St. Joseph the Worker Church in Yacolt, effective February 1, 2010.

### **PAROCHIAL VICAR**

*The term of office for Parochial Vicar in the Archdiocese of Seattle is generally three years.*



**Rev. Anthony K. Davis,** appointed Parochial Vicar of St. Edward Church in Seattle, St. George

Church in Seattle and St. Paul Church in Seattle, effective February 1, 2010.



**Rev. Raphael M. Salzillo, OP,** appointed Parochial Vicar of Blessed Sacrament Church in Seattle,

effective August 18, 2009.

### **CHAPLAIN**

*The term of office for Chaplain in the Archdiocese of Seattle is generally three years.*



**Rev. Willybard K. Lagho,** appointed Adjunct Chaplain of Catholic Schools in

Seattle, effective October 23, 2009.

**PASTOR:** A priest appointed by the Archbishop and delegated as the leader of a particular parish entrusted to him. The pastor's role, expressed in its threefold mission of teaching, governing and sanctifying (CIC, c. 519), empowers the laity for their mission as light and leaven in the world.

**PRIEST ADMINISTRATOR:** A priest appointed by the Archbishop as a temporary leader of a particular parish. He has the same authority as a pastor. (CIC, c. 540 §1-3). This office may be held, for example, by seasoned, newly arrived priests or by newly ordained priests who require more experience and formation before being assigned as pastors.

**PRIEST MODERATOR:** A priest appointed by the Archbishop with powers and faculties of a pastor for a parish. His role is to monitor and mentor the pastoral coordinator and parochial vicar, and to act as canonical pastor to the parish community to whom an ecclesial lay minister has been appointed (CIC, c. 517 §2).

**PAROCHIAL VICAR:** A priest who renders service in pastoral ministry as a co-worker with the pastor, and sharing service in pastoral ministry through common counsel and effort and under his authority (CIC, c. 545 §1-2).

**CHAPLAIN:** A priest appointed by the Archbishop to provide pastoral care to a faith community within the Archdiocese. (CIC, c. 564)

**PASTORAL COORDINATOR:** A deacon, religious or lay ecclesial minister appointed by the Archbishop under the supervision of a moderator and entrusted with the day-to-day leadership of a parish or faith community (CIC, c. 517 §2).

**DEACON:** A deacon may be appointed to a ministerial position by the Archbishop under the supervision of a pastor or other designated person by means of a Ministry Agreement.

### **DEACON**

*Ministry appointments for Deacons in the Archdiocese of Seattle are generally three years.*



**Deacon Samuel T. Basta,** appointed Deacon of Christ Our Hope Church in Seattle,

effective October 28, 2009, while continuing at St. Louise de Marillac Church, Bellevue.



**Deacon Terrance G. Marcell,** appointed Deacon of Christ Our Hope Church in Seattle,

effective October 28, 2009.



**Deacon Lawrence McDonald,** appointed Deacon of Christ Our Hope Church in Seattle, effective

October 28, 2009, while continuing at St. Monica Church, Mercer Island.
